## **COMPLAINTS PROCEDURE**

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Risk Warning: Trading Forex and Contracts for Difference (CFDs) on margin carries a high level of risk and may not be suitable for everybody. If they are unable to resolve the matter to your satisfaction, you may escalate the complaints to our Compliance department.

The Compliance Department will carry out an impartial review of the complaint with a view to understanding what did or did not happen and to assess whether we have acted fairly within our rights and have met our contractual and other obligations.

To enable us to investigate and resolve your case as quickly as possible, please include the following: • Your name, email address and Account (TP) number.

- ◆ A clear and concise summary of the issue or complaint
- ◆ What you would like us to do to put matters right
- ◆ Copies of any relevant correspondence or emails
- ◆ A daytime contact telephone number

Once received, it will be dealt with in accordance with our complaints handling procedures, summarized below.

1. All complaints will be promptly acknowledged within 3 working days.
2. Any complaint will be investigated, and we will send a final response or a progress report within 4 weeks.
3. Where a final response is not possible within 4 weeks, we will attempt to finalize it within 8 weeks. If we are unable to provide a response within this timeframe, we shall write and explain why and advise when a final response can be expected.
4. At all times, we shall treat customers fairly and with transparency in accordance with the Cayman Islands Monetary Authority protocol.
5. Should more than 8 weeks pass without a final response, or the customer is dissatisfied with the final response (or at any stage through the process) the matter may be referred to the Cayman Islands Monetary Authority (CIMA).

The complaint must be referred to CIMA within 1 year of the date of the final response letter. The Cayman Islands Monetary Authority acts as an impartial adjudicator in the resolution of disputes and complaints with financial services firms in the Cayman Islands. The service is completely free of charge.
